Remarks from Pastor Allison



Big changes are coming! We are ready to resume in-person worship, though in a different way than when we last gathered in March. We will be worshiping outdoors in our courtyard! In talking with DS Debra Brady, she indicated that outdoor worship is preferable and that the Porterville churches were trying it in July. Julia Summers began modifications to our relaunch protocol and I visited the Porterville service on their first Sunday. The more the relaunch team talked, the more excited we became.

So, what will this look like? We will have canopies set up on the lawn for worshipers with chairs that will already have any worship materials (order of service and communion for August 2nd) in place when you arrive. You will enter by the south gate (by the office) and leave by the west gate.

Your temperature will be checked and masks are required. You will be escorted to your place by one of the ushers and we will maintain social distancing. Family groups will sit together.

Landes and part of the praise band will be on the upper level bringing us music. I'll be on the lower level using a platform for better viewing. I'll be wearing a face shield as well. I'll have a children's message for the young people in attendance, and we will have some packets for them. The service will be about 40-45 minutes.

After worship, you will be escorted to the west gate exit. I know that it will be tempting to linger and visit with folks after the service, but I ask you to continue practicing good habits, including masks and keeping six feet apart.

If you are not comfortable attending worship in person right now, don't worry! Our online worship service will continue as before. Look for the link no later than Sunday morning in your email or on Facebook.

Additionally, we will begin a Zoom Bible study this month on 2 Corinthians. In this letter Paul addresses the nature of discipleship and how a disciple responds to and transforms pain and suffering. How appropriate for our time!

Protocols for Worship:

Our protocols have been approved and we will be able to have In-person Worship Services, beginning August 2! We will be meeting together outside in the Courtyard. In order to continue having In-person Worship Services, we must all work together to follow all of the safety protocols. Remember John Wesley's Three Simple Rules: Do no harm. Do good. Stay in love with God. Here are the safety protocols and instructions we are to follow:


- Make reservations with the Church office. Call Lynnda Boswell (559) 302-8451 or Julia Summers (559) 901-5067. Let us know how many in your family will be seated together and what service you would prefer. 8:30 or 10:00 a.m.
- Arrive at the Church 20 to 30 minutes before the service begins in order to allow for time to enter. Use the South gate.
- Your temperature will be taken at the gate.
- Once inside the gate, use the hand sanitizer from the touchless dispenser.
- Wear a mask on the Church grounds. Masks are to be worn at all times.
- Please do not greet anyone with a hug or handshake. Waves and friendly greetings are wonderful!
- Inside the Courtyard, you will be guided to your seat by an usher.
- After the service, ushers will direct you to the west gate to exit.
- The offering plate will be at the west gate at the end of the service.
- As you exit, please use the hand sanitizer again.
- Only the bathroom off the Educational wing will be used. Lower the toilet before flushing
 the toilet. Be sure to wash your hands with soap and water and use the hand sanitizer
 again at the outer door. An usher will be at the outer door.
- If water or tissue is needed, please signal to an usher and they will bring it to you.
- You are welcome to bring an umbrella as a sun shield.



Getting to know Pastor Allison and her getting to know you is tough in these times of limited gatherings and social distancing. But we have come up with a way! Beginning August 10th, we will have a series of small group opportunities for you to come and spend some time with Pastor Allison. It'll be your chance to ask her anything (and she means ANYTHING!) and find out more about her. It'll also be her time to meet you and learn more about you and our church.

The meetings will be held in the courtyard at 10 AM and limited to no more than 10 people, including Pastor Allison. We will all wear masks and chairs will be sanitized and placed six feet apart. Meetings will be Tuesday through Thursday of the weeks of August 9th, August 16th, and August 23rd. Please contact Lynnda in the office to schedule the time you want to come.

If you are not comfortable attending in person, or none of these dates work for you, we will also have Zoom meeting opportunities available, one each week. Emails with dates and times for Zoom will be sent out with the Zoom login information.


