Andrew Josiah opened the gathering with prayer, and a meal was shared, an additional 5 men whose schedules conflicted with the meeting time threw their names in the hat, expressing willingness to support efforts to reshape the men's organization. It was agreed that for the immediate future, the fellowship will meet several times a year to complete selected repair projects building upon the skill levels represented, taking on projects consistent with the goals of the Trustees, and supporting efforts of fundraising as needed. For now, the group will be called "Tool Time Volunteers", led by a steering committee of Chp., Ron Vaughan, Steve Tarin Jr., Greg Smith, and Jim Maxfield. Projects will be selected, a call list developed, and projects will be undertaken. With considerable enthusiasm, appreciation for a great meal, the meeting closed with prayer by Jeffrey Chavez.




Mary's Musings

By now most of you have realized that I am a United Methodist fan girl! There are a lot of things that I love about the founding principles of Methodism, about the theology of John Wesley, and about our organizational structure. One of the things I like best is that we are a "connectional system" – Tulare UMC is not free standing – instead, we are connected through our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness to a mission and ministry of disciple making and transformation in the name of Jesus Christ that is worldwide. That excites me. One of the most concrete ways that this is expressed is that we send 10 cents of every dollar you give as a tithe toward the mission and ministry of our United Methodist connection. This tithe supports many programs I love, including the infrastructure of United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which is why 100% of UMCOR

giving goes directly to disaster relief and rebuilding. Our tithe helps support the pensions for all retired pastors who have ever served in United Methodist congregations. I am proud that when their time of active service is over, we help support those who have supported us. The tithe we pay has had a very personal impact on my family: tithe monies provided salary and resources for the missionaries who went to South Africa and inspired my husband to answer his call to the ministry; tithe monies provided scholarships for both my husband and me to complete our Masters of Divinity (and tithe monies provide for support of Methodist Colleges and Seminaries both in the United States and worldwide); when my husband died, tithe monies offered survivor benefits for my children, which made it possible for me to take time out from ministry to concentrate on their healing; and tithe monies now are helping to underwrite John and Zola's college educations through a scholarship program the United Methodist Church offers the children of clergy who have died when their children are under the age of 18. That scholarship money provided through tithes is one of the reasons I am able to afford to work for a 3/4 time salary at TUMC and still meet my personal financial obligations. At the District Conference we hosted last month, TUMC received a certificate stating that we paid 100% of our tithe for 2018. I am proud of us! I know how much good your giving does both in our community and in the world. In the Resurrection Spirit of Christ, Pastor Mary

Member of the Month - Bishop Award Winner - GREG SMITH




During Annual Conference on February 21st, Greg Smith was presented with the Bishop's Award for outstanding effort in leading a local Church toward revitalization. This is a portion of the nomination letter Pastor Mary Maaga sent to Bishop Minerva Carcano.




Dear Bishop Carcano,

Greg Smith embodies what it means to be a Christian disciple committed to disciple-making for the transformation of the world.

- 1) Attending to his spiritual growth: Greg Smith is a loyal, committed, and engaged participant in our weekly No Barriers Bible Study; he also attended Adult Sunday School until he was recruited to be a teacher at that same time for our Youth Confirmation Class; unless out of town, he is always in Worship. He also embodies "love your neighbor" by consistently and lovingly reaching out to homeless and marginally housed people who come to our Bible Study and Worship. There is overwhelming Christian hospitality at the heart of this man.
- 2) Providing leadership: Mr. Smith has held every leadership position at Tulare UMC in the past 40 years. He carries on the legacy of leadership from his parents Gwen and Barton Smith, who were enthusiastic members of TUMC until their passing in 2017. Most recently he has held Chair of Outreach, which oversees TUMC's outreach to the homeless and neighborhood children and youth, as well as our Clothes Closet and Breakfast Before Church. He serves on the board of Reaching Higher an ecumenical Christian after school program for children and youth. Greg was an early supporter of our No Barriers Bible Study which provides a hot meal and Bible Study to a mix of homeless, marginally housed. and members of Tulare UMC, as well as other area Churches. When this Bible Study started nearly two years ago, Mr. Smith was one of a dozen people who attended. Now we average 45-60 people at Bible Study, with additional people coming for the meal but not staying. When we struggled with needing to switch some leaders around in order to provide a fresh start for our Finance and Stewardship Team, he was more than willing to step into the role of Church Council Chair. He is admired by all for his devotion to Jesus Christ and his loyalty to the United Methodist Church. If we in the Church Office ever need anything – a consultation, a signature on a check, etc. – he will drop everything to get here. He loves his Church.
- 3) Making disciples: When the youth team embarked on creating a Confirmation Class, they asked Greg Smith to become one of the leaders. His desire to see the faith of his father and mother passed on to the next generation is palpable. He openly embraces those who are struggling with their faith and is clear about who is at the center of his: Jesus Christ. Greg Smith's prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness are major factors in the current revitalization of Tulare UMC.







My experience at Annual Conference this year was different than the past two years because I am different! In the past few months I've really connected with the *Holy Spirit* and God's Grace. The beautiful Tulare UMC with Pastor Mary and the work of the Worship Team has been important to Sunday Worship, Bishop Carcaño's visit, and Pentecost Sunday have all touched me very deeply. With these experiences, and others, I was able to connect and really believe that *With Jesus in the Boat*, we can do anything and everything.

Annual Conference began with **Bishop Carcaño**'s message, *Call to Order* and *Celebration of Communion*. Tulare UMC representatives of the Central Valley District met in Modesto along with the other districts. The theme, *With Jesus in the Boat*, and Scripture from Matt. 8:23-27 worked well! (*The boat was small, it was a big storm, and where was Jesus? He was asleep. So, the disciples woke him! What did Jesus do? He calmed the winds and the waves. The disciples were amazed and asked, "What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him?")*

What were our responsibilities?

We received the Report from General Conference 2019 in St. Louis and participated in two-hour sessions on Wednesday and Thursday evenings for *Christian Conferencing on Strategic Visioning.* We were conferencing about **staying together** in the midst of the storm that threatens to divide us.

We met in Legislative sessions. My particular session addressed benefits for active and especially for retired clergy. This was meaningful and connected with our privilege of meeting up with Pastors Latu, Les, Mike Harrell, Linda Ford and retired Pastors who served in Tulare: Jane and David Schlager, Jim Scott (and Terri) and Marty Murdock.

We participated in "Fixing of Appointments" as each church in the entire Conference received the name of their pastor(s), and we all prayed for the coming year *With Jesus in the Boat*.

We voted for Clergy and Laity representatives to the **2020 General Conference**, which has world-wide representation and meets every four years.

WE CELEBRATED: 150 years with UNITED METHODIST WOMEN; 200 years with Global Ministries, including missionary Katherine Parker's work. Highlighting and putting Tulare on the map was volunteer, Greg Smith, who was one of four laity who received the BISHOP'S AWARD, and Pastor Mary Maaga as she was reinstated with Elder's Orders, Rev. Mary Maaga! About 20 of our congregation came to Modesto on Friday to participate in the celebrations; we also enjoyed

dinner together, hosted by Rev. Maaga; thank you, Pastor Mary for being our shepherd in the way forward With Jesus in the Boat.

Ditto for Jesse Ramirez.


Wonderful to have Mike Huddleston back in town for most of a week. We love and miss you, Brother Mike.

The image you see at the top of this article is the Stephen Ministry Caregiver's Compass and it is central to all of our training sessions. The symbol at the center of the Compass is a Chi - Rho which consists of the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ. This symbol reminds us that Jesus is always at the center of our caring ministry.

The four points of the Compass indicate four very important characteristics of our care givers. Stephen Ministers are compassionate. They are full of faith. They are skilled and they are trustworthy. Our training sessions are centered on this compass and encourages our growth in each of these areas.

Thus far our training has involved developing skills in areas that deal with feelings, listening, assertiveness, maintaining boundaries and confidentiality. It is our prayer that God will use our caregivers with these qualities to bring healing and wholeness to others.



COMPASSION

The Outreach Committee has joined in all the activity occurring around our church campus. Thanks to Jessica Stone, the former articles stored for "Dress for Success" have been moved to other local Thrift Stores, holding back some winter clothes. Jessica has rearranged the Clothes Closet

emphasizing men sizes (pants 32" to 36") women's sizes (small and medium), and a variety of children sizes. In addition to supplying clothes for the homeless, Jessica is preparing small bags to include hygiene products for both men and women. For the summer months and into the fall, the Closet will focus upon clothing, socks, hygiene, and household incidentals for families moving from homeless to housing. Plans still remain to periodically provide a day for neighbors who appreciate having access to some of the clothes the Closet provides. Outreach funds for the Summer and Fall will be used to purchase selected clothing items, emergency food provided through the office (Lynnda Boswell), and water purchased for distribution. Remaining "budgeted" funds will be held for early winter needs.

Katerine Parker, United Methodist Missionary to Nepal visited Tulare United Methodist Church on Thursday, June 13, 2019. A small group was in attendance; however, we represented four United Methodist Churches: Tulare, Exeter, Reedley and Visalia. Tulare MWF invited Katherine and supported our guests with refreshments and an audio-visual technician (Andrew Summers) for the presentation.

Katherine is one of 350 UMC missionaries serving our Connectional Church around the world. She told us about the history of Christianity coming to Nepal, culture of the area, and the work they are doing today. Those present contributed \$359 to support Katherine and the United Mission to Nepal.

Thank you Methodist Women for the great honor of being chosen "Man of the Year for 2019" I was very surprised, even when it was mentioned that the recipient was interested in history - I thought it could be someone else!
