First, let me say I'm a big fan of synergy. Simply stated, synergy means two (or more) heads are better than one. That was evident at our 2020 Vision meeting on September 29 and from the cards that were submitted listing your top priorities for a new pastor. Everyone's votes were counted, but these were at the top of the list.

Overwhelmingly, the top priority was for the new pastor to continue the programs Pastor Mary has started including, but not limited to, No Barriers Bible Study, Stephen Ministries, and expanded educational offerings for children, youth and adults.

Next, we want our new pastor to be a powerful speaker and teacher. He or she must also be able to interact effectively with people who attend our different types of services and programs. We also wanted him or her to be skilled at conflict resolution.

Next, he or she must be dedicated to our youth and their programs; dedicated to pastoral care for the sick and elderly; and, join one or more community groups, including groups that address the homeless population in our community.

Rounding out your list of top priorities, our new pastor must have good administrative and leadership development skills.

As chairperson of the Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee, I'd like to thank everyone for your input regarding the future of our church.

In August, the hospitality **"Breakfast Before Church"** in August averaged 55 guest breakfasts. The largest Sunday was 64 guests. In September the average attendance was 65, and the largest Sunday was 79.

The Clothing Closet is becoming a well-known friendly place where our homeless Community feel welcome to get the things they need, and its growing every week. Just within last month we have helped 164 people with not only clothing, but hygiene products and blankets. I personally want to thank everyone for all the donations and the generosity of our church members, without you we wouldn't have a clothing closet. No matter how small a donation you give, it matters to someone who we help. So please continue to keep giving and donating our homeless community


Flower Boxes
